### FIS SKI JUMPING WORLD CUP ZAKOPANE 2018 TEAM COMPETITION

Team competition in Zakopane amazed for sure even the most exacting ski jumping supporters in the world. Polish athletes – Maciej Kot, Stefan Hula, Dawid Kubacki and Kamil Stoch – was unbeatable and won the event in an amazing style. For Stefan Horngacher's team it was an extraordinary evening, because they won the competition in Zakopane for the first time in history. Kamil Stoch established a new hill record. With a jump of 141.5 meters long he beaten Simon Ammann's record from 2010.







### FIS SKI JUMPING WORLD CUP ZAKOPANE 2018 INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION

After the amazing performance of the Polish team in the team competition fans was waiting for the same good results to be made in the individual event. But at Sunday the most important role was played by the wind. Eventually the individual competition won Anze Semenic. It was the first World Cup win for this young Slovenian ski jumper. Second place went to Andreas Wellinger and another Slovenian athlete Peter Prevc stood at the third step of the podium. The best of Polish ski jumpers was Stefan Hula (4th place).



### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

During the competitions the streets around the Wielka Krokiew are off to car traffic.

We propose to use the available parking in the city:

- Parking at the train station, Chramcówki street
- Parking by the Zaruskiego street
- Parking by the Aleje 3 maja street (upper)
- Parking area next to the lower station of the Gubałówka lift
- Parking for buses by the Aleja 3 maja street (lower)
- Parking for buses by the Nowotarska street

There are also smaller parkings located by the streets in the center of Zakopane:

- ♦ Gimnazjalna street (next to TESCO)
- Henryka Sienkiewicza street
- ♦ Tadeusza Kościuszki street
- ♦ Słoneczna street
- ♦ Jagiellońska street
- ♦ Niepodległości Square
- Ks. Józefa Stolarczyka street
- Stanisława Witkiewicza street





### **WORTH TO SEE IN ZAKOPANE**

- ♦ **Krupowki street** the most popular street in Zakopane. Extremely picturesque place buzzes from morning to evening. Over a kilometer along the promenade there are many regional restaurants, shops, and local attractions.
- ◆ Cable car to Kasprowy Wierch this peak provides incredibly beautiful views, which spreads around, but also the unfogettable ride up the hill by cable car, which lasts 12 minutes.
- ♦ **Gubalowka** one of the most visited places in Zakopane. You can get on by special train. After a few minutes of entering restaurants, pavement cafés and stalls with regional products are avaiable for visitors
- ♦ Museum Villa Koliba Zakopane Style Museum, (the first house built in the Zakopane style, designed by Stanisław Witkiewicz. It is located at Kościeliska Street, the oldest street of Zakopane)
- ◆ Tatra Museum a museum which has the largest number of exhibits and educational issues
- ♦ Cemetery on "Peksowym Brzyzku" the first Zakopane cemetery registered as a monument. It is located at Kościeliska street. It is one of the most important Polish necropolis, where can be found dozens of graves of prominent people.
